Community Involvement:

Lifeguard taught a community CPR class for 28 local residents. Early activation of CPR for cardiac arrest patients helps significantly decrease their potential deficits, while also improving their survival rates.

Chief Myers continues to seek opportunities to further integrate Lifeguard into community events, as well as build upon the first responder network. In June, he was selected to chair the planning committee for the Weatherford Hospital Foundation's golf tournament fundraiser that will be held later this fall. Additionally, he attended the Custer County Fire Chiefs monthly meeting to further cultivate those professional relationships.

Additionally, Lifeguard provided standby services for Weatherford Fire Department during a residential structural fire and motor vehicle accident that required extended extrication; Lifeguard also provided EMS standby for a structural fire in Hydro. Having EMS on-site allows immediate access for firefighter rehab, such as oxygen, or if any firefighters become injured during the emergency response.

Joint Training:

The Lifeguard team in Weatherford is growing with the addition of two paramedics and two EMTs. These individuals completed their new hire classroom and field training orientation in June.

As a follow-up to the aforementioned motor vehicle accident, Lifeguard and Weatherford Fire Department participated in a post-incident debriefing. This meeting allowed the crews and leadership teams time to discuss the incident, review areas for improvement, and reflect about what went well during the response. These debriefings further allows the first responders to improve on their inter-agency teamwork, thus further strengthening the emergency response, while also making it more effective.
