Community Involvement:



Lifeguard participated in the Touch-A-Truck event in Weatherford at Rader Park. Lifeguard's team member talked about the on-board equipment, services, and 911. The community event also served as a fundraiser for the Weatherford Police Department with the proceeds going towards children's kits at the police department.

Lifeguard also provided standby services for the Run for the Wall event in May. This event covers the nation from California to Washington D.C. with veterans riding motorcycles cross-country to the Vietnam Memorial Wall. Weatherford was a designated food and fuel stop and the participants also had the opportunity to visit the Thomas Stafford Air and Space Museum.



EMS Week:

As part of EMS Week, the Weatherford Mayor issued a city proclamation, officially declaring May 21-27 as EMS Week. The week



is a nationally-dedicated time of the year to recognize and celebrate the dedication and hard work of EMS professionals. The theme for 2017 was "EMS Strong: Always in Service." Throughout the week, Lifeguard's leadership team strived to make the week memorable, while making sure to truly demonstrate its gratitude and appreciation of its team.



Lifeguard celebrated the week with meals for the crews, special treats, and more. Along with Weatherford Police and Fire departments and Air Evac, Lifeguard's teams enjoyed a delicious cookout and spent time relaxing with the other first responders. Lifeguard would like to thank the local businesses, healthcare organizations, public safety entities, and other community members for taking the time to recognize the local EMS professionals and all that they do for the community through their service.



Lifeguard also celebrated "Firefighter Day" and "Law Enforcement Day" in May.



Joint Training:

Lifeguard taught 14 CPR classes in May; these were primarily for the nursing and pharmacy students at SWOSU that needed to complete their CPR certifications. Lifeguard also held training for its team members for renewal of their emergency vehicle operators course (EVOC). A mandatory certification required by the Oklahoma State Department of Health, this training verifies a first responder's ability to safely maneuver and operate an emergency vehicle through various situations.

Disaster Efforts:

Working with local partners through disasters is an important part of the public safety network. Lifeguard was able to send a Weatherford crew for additional support to Elk City during the recent tornado disaster, while the Lifeguard-Elk City team supported the local 911 and search/rescue efforts. Subsequently, these storms also impacted a local facility, and Lifeguard assisted with the evacuation of the residents to the hospital for temporary shelter.
