COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT:

Lifeguard had the opportunity to attend Hydro Fire Department's annual fundraiser dinner and auction. The auction was to raise money to buy the fire department new self-contained breathing apparatus's.

Lifeguard provided a unit for a live fire standby in Corn for multiple agencies' live fire training. the national fire protection agency requires ambulance on location to monitor firefighters while conducting live training exercises. The training allowed the firefighters to truly practice their skills in a controlled environment and situation.

Lifeguard had the opportunity to attend Corn Fire Department's fun night fundraiser. During this event, Lifeguard's team gave truck tours and explained the use of ALS equipment to the community.



JOINT TRAINING:

Lifeguard held AHA refresher courses for ambulance staff and had attendees from Hydro Fire and OU Medical Center. This training was to renew AHA Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support certifications. These certifications are required for all paramedics to maintain their National Registry and state licenses.
