We have purchased some new games for us to learn. Come join us in the craft room on January 6th, 27th and 29th at 10:00 a.m. if you would like to have some fun!

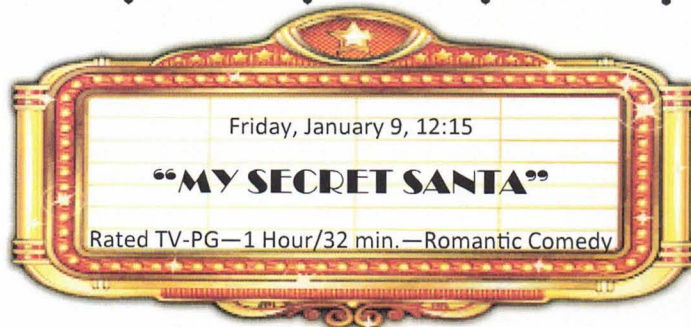

From the director of “The Princess Switch” trilogy comes this holly-jolly rom-com about a single mom who wears an elaborate disguise to get a Santa job.



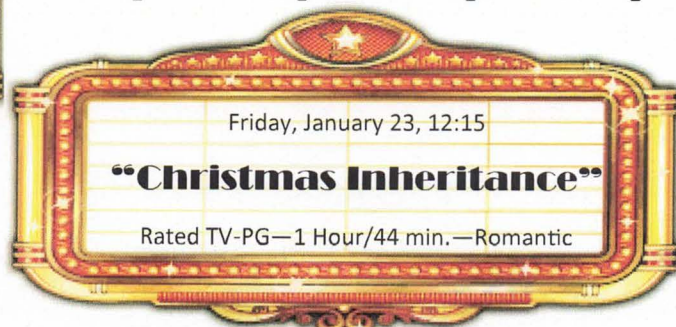
To host the ultimate Christmas gala, a jaded event planner attends a bootcamp to find the jolliest Santa and rekindles her love for the festive season.
