Applesauce Cookies

1 Package Spice Cake Mix 1/2 Cup Cooking Oil
1 Cup Raisins 1 Egg
1/2 Cup Applesauce Pecans

Combine spice cake mix, raisins, oil, applesauce, egg, and pecans. Beat 1 minute. Drop 1 teaspoon on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 6 dozen.

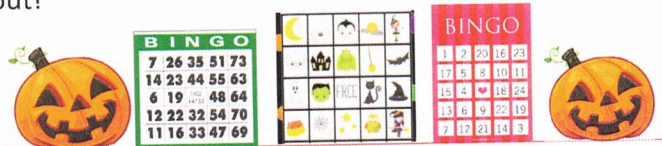
